



Travel & Transport

Buses: Lancaster Bus Station is situated on Damside Street in the city centre and is served by Stagecoach and National Express (currently night service only).

Lancaster University campus is also served by Megabus. Lancaster University campus is about 3 miles from the city centre. Buses run very regularly from the university campus throughout the day and take around 20 minutes to reach the city centre.

Buses cost from £2.60 single or £3.40 return – or you can buy a **UniRider** discount season ticket, available online from the Stagecoach website. www.stagecoachbus.com.

The **University of Cumbria** campus is situated on Bowerham Road, a few minutes' walk from Lancaster City Centre.

Megabus: runs daily from Lancaster University and costs £18.30 for a single fare to London Victoria, running via Preston, Manchester and Birmingham.

Trains: Lancaster Railway Station is situated just outside the city centre on Meeting House Lane. One of the principal stations on the West Coast Main Line, it is served by TransPennine Express, Northern & Avanti.

A **16-25 Railcard** is available for approximately £30 a year, offering discounts on local and national rail travel www.16-25railcard.co.uk




Parking

The city centre car parks can be viewed here: Car parks - Lancaster City Council. Parking charges start from £1 for 30 minutes. The RingGo app offers a 7 day parking permit for £16.60 which can be used in any City Council car park. Use location code 4975 on the Ringgo app to access the 7 day permit option

Living off campus: Be aware that many streets in town require Residents' Parking Permits which can be obtained from www.lancashire.gov.uk/parking. These incur a yearly charge of around £25.





Shopping

Lancaster and Morecambe offer both popular high street stores and interesting boutique shops. Shop opening times are usually 9am – 5.30pm on Mondays to Saturdays. On Sundays (and Bank Holidays), due to Sunday Trading laws, most shops, including the larger supermarkets, only open between 10am – 4pm or 11am – 5pm. A few smaller "convenience" stores such as **Spar, Tesco Metro** and **Sainsbury's Local** open longer on Sundays.

Weekend Wanderings: There's life beyond campus...

Day out ideas!

MORNING

Why not treat yourself to morning brunch or a light lunch in one of Lancaster's diverse cafés and restaurants...a bacon sandwich or a home-made cake at Printroom Café Bar in The Storey, a conveyor belt of sushi at Nami Sushi, a leisurely coffee at Journey Social or a vegetarian or vegan treat at The Whale Tail, Purely Vegan or The Herbarium...there's something to tickle everyone's tastebuds in the city centre.

AFTERNOON

In the afternoon, puzzle over clues at Lancaster's Escape Room with themed experiences including a Pendle Witch room, or try LancasterWall, an exciting new climbing wall experience on the Lune Industrial Estate.

If you feel like going a bit further afield, jump on the 6A bus from Lancaster bus station and head across the river to Salt Ayre Leisure Centre to try out the leisure facilities, swimming pool or climbing wall. Or travel on into Morecambe and get your bounce on at Jump Rush Trampoline Centre or try your hand at bowling at Soul Bowl.

If you're feeling like taking it easy, perhaps spend an afternoon in Williamson Park, meandering the winding woodland pathways, visiting the Butterfly House, meeting the meerkats and the marmosets, and enjoying coffee and cake in the Pavilion Café.

EVENING

Lancaster offers a host of entertainment options in the evening - take your pick of blockbusters at the Vue cinema; theatre or comedy at the Grand Theatre, or drama and film at The Dukes Theatre & Cinema. Kanteena is a great venue for music and comedy events in a quirky setting.

In the evening, look for happy hours on pizza and pasta at the Spaghetti House and The Cornerhouse. The Borough in Dalton Square, Pizza Margherita and The Quarterhouse on Moor Lane all offer great food with a welcoming atmosphere.

If you fancy a drink, Tipple and the Study Rooms offer wide ranging cocktail menus and the Tap House, Jailor's Barrel and The Sun offer great real ale choices. Many city centre pubs host live music including the John O' Gaunt, the Bobbin, the Pub and the Stonewell Tap. Or test out the grey matter at a quiz at the Bowerham Hotel (Tues), The Sun (Tues), White Cross (Tues), Study Rooms (Thurs), or Merchants 1688 (Sunday).

MORNING

Spend the morning in Lancaster, visiting the City Museum which houses a fascinating collection of Roman artefacts and The King's Own Royal Regiment Museum, or taking a tour of the atmospheric 11th century Lancaster Castle where experienced guides will treat you to tales of the royal personages and dignitaries; wretches and malefactors who lived in and visited this imposing medieval fort.

Or wander the cobbled streets and step back in time as you enter Atkinson's - a traditional coffee roaster and tea merchant offering speciality blends carefully sourced, imported, and roasted on the premises, producing an intoxicating smell which permeates the city's streets.

AFTERNOON

In the afternoon, learn about Lancaster's seafaring past at the Maritime Museum, or try a Kingfisher Cruise on the Lancaster canal (May - September) - simply discover the beauty of the waterways or opt for a themed cruise - choose from comedy to music, afternoon tea to ghost cruises!

Alternatively, just a few miles from Lancaster you will discover the stunning coastline of Morecambe Bay...as you stroll along Morecambe's Promenade you'll gaze out across the panoramic landscape to the Lakeland hills beyond. If visiting during a summer weekend, call into the Winter Gardens, a fascinating old-time music hall building now undergoing restoration. Then treat yourself to a traditional soft-scoop ice cream, or even to Afternoon Tea (make sure you pre-book!) at the wonderfully refurbished Art Deco Midland Hotel.

If you love nature and wildlife, there is no better destination than Morecambe Bay. Just a few miles up the coast in Silverdale is RSPB Leighton Moss, a nature reserve which is home to some rare and lovely bird, butterfly, plant and animal species.

EVENING

An evening in Morecambe could be spent at The Platform, renowned for its variety of music events, at Soul Bowl for a spot of bowling or quizzing (Quiz Thursdays) or if you're heading back to Lancaster, check What's On at The Dukes or Grand Theatre. Dine out in Lancaster's historic quarters - at the White Cross or Toll House Inn on the canal, or The Three Mariners, the Wagon & Horses or Quite Simply French on St George's Quay. The many restaurants in the city centre offer choices from Thai to Turkish - so you certainly won't go hungry during your evening explorations!
