

Access Statement for Lancaster Cottage Museum

This access statement does not contain personal opinions as to our suitability for those with access needs, but aims to accurately describe the facilities and services that we offer all our visitors.



Introduction

Cottage Museum.

The Cottage Museum is located on Castle Hill, and faces Lancaster Castle. It was built in 1739 and is furnished as an artisan's house of around 1820. It is spread over five floors.

Pre-Arrival

Lancaster Railway station is less than 1 mile away and has a taxi rank situated outside. Both major local taxi services can provide accessible vehicles (see p.4 for details).

Lancaster Bus station is less than 1 mile away and the route from the station to the cottage is up a mild uphill slope.

Pedestrian access to the museum is good, with wide pavements.

Car Parking and Arrival

There is limited pay and display on street parking opposite the cottage. The nearest blue badge parking in on Church Street, or on New Street at the back of the City Museum.

An A-board is placed directly outside the entrance when the cottage is open to the public.

Main Entrance, Reception and Shop

The main entrance is via the front door of the building. The door is quite low and has a minor uneven step to enter. Once through the main entrance, a staff member, located in the parlour, will greet visitors and will provide admission information and orientation.

The parlour has a stone floor which is partially covered by a rag rug. The floor is uneven throughout the building. Shop items are sold by the staff member on duty, who sits at a table. A guide is provided, which is currently available in English only.

The cottage benefits from a combination of electric lighting, and natural light that comes in through small windows throughout the building, except for the attic. In the main entrance, the main door is left open at all times when it is open to the public, which lets in plenty of natural light.

Attraction (displays, exhibits etc.)

From the parlour, visitors can access the cellar on the lower ground floor, and the first and second floors above. Staircases are narrow and uneven, with low ceilings which visitors are warned about when they enter to avoid injury. Many objects are common items, or reproductions and are not kept behind glass. The furniture is very fragile and visitors will be informed of this by the staff member on duty.

Public Toilets

There are no public toilets available at the Cottage Museum.

Additional Information

Assistance dogs are welcome in the museum.

Future Plans

We hope to provide the orientation guide to the cottage in more than one language.

We aim to improve the availability of interpretation on the ground floor so that more of the collection and building can be accessed by everyone.
